



2017 Summer Internship Description & Application

Program Overview:

The mission of Start the Heart Foundation is to save the lives of cardiac arrest victims through training and education. Our foundation trains pre-medical students to become hands only CPR facilitators. Our interns will teach hands-only CPR to community groups, companies and churches during the day, some evenings and on weekends. Weekend classes are usually scheduled in morning or early afternoon on Saturdays and Sundays.

We are looking for 3 students who are interested in a career in medicine or public health and have some public speaking experience. Each team of 3 hands-only CPR interns will teach our hands-only CPR class which includes demographic data collection of class recipients, an educational talk on cardiac arrest, an instructional video, a hands-only CPR demonstration, an AED demonstration and practice supervision. The CPR classes last approximately 30-40 minutes. Class sizes vary from 10 people up to 90 people. Volunteers will usually have 2 days off per week and time off around the 4th of July.

Training will begin on June 4th 2017. Volunteers will take a CPR certification class and learn and practice the presentation with the other volunteers. Volunteers will need to be available to commit to teaching classes between June 12th and August 12th.

Activities and Commitment:

- Become trained in hands-only CPR by Louisville Emergency Medical Services trainer.
- Learn medical aspects of cardiac arrest as it relates to CPR.
- Learn how to educate and demonstrate automated external defibrillator (AED) use.
- Learn and teach the established Start the Heart curriculum.
- Teach hands-only CPR to students and various community groups
- Obtain demographic data from students.
- Enter demographic data.
- Write experiential blog.
- Write up and present data for publication or at a scientific meeting
- Must have a reliable car.
